## Easy-to-follow Dog Bathing Tips

Bathing your dog is not as hard as it seems.

Brush your dog to get rid of mats and tangles before giving them a bath. Water is trapped in matted fur which can cause skin irritation. Brushing your dog can help clear clogged drains if they shed a lot.

Instead of using hot water always use lukewarm water. Due to their sensitive skin dogs may experience dryness or irritation from high temperatures. Always check the temperature of the water with your hand before taking a bath.

Shampoo should be applied from the neck down avoiding the eyes and ears. For delicate faces try use a tearless pet shampoo. Try using a bath brush or a dog friendly loofah for additional cleaning.

Consider putting a non-slip mat in the tub if your dog is a frequent walker. It prevents you from slipping and gives them a sense of security.

After the bath make sure they're completely dry. Drying time is reduced with a microfiber towel that is incredibly absorbent. Use the lowest setting on a pet safe hair dryer if your dog is tolerant.

Trick: To keep your dog calm and distracted attach a peanut butter covered lick mat to the tub wall.
